

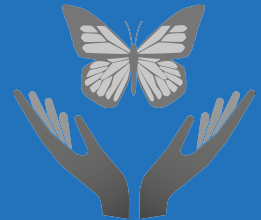

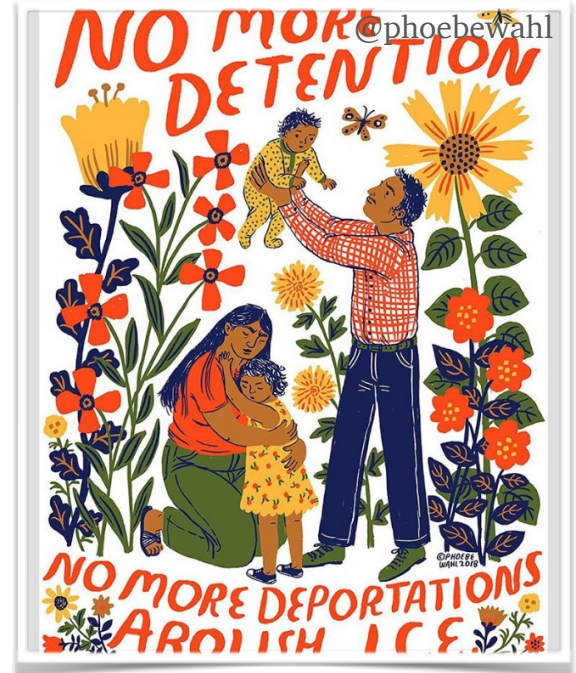

1 Where do things stand with DACA?

“Courts in California and New York ordered the government to continue processing DACA renewals, but they did not order it to process new applications.” -(ACLU, 2018)

2 Family Separation isn't new

“For the past few months, images of distressed migrant children have populated American newsfeeds and television screens. Many of the children are the victims of “family separation,” their parents deported from the U.S. without them; while detained without their parents, some of them have been forbidden from being hugged. The Trump administration has defended family separation, then backtracked on the policy, then started to reunite families at the order of a federal judge.” -(The Atlantic, 2018)

3 Citizenship Question on 2020 Census

“When it comes to the Census, everybody counts. But when it comes to the Trump Administration’s plans to ask everybody about their citizenship status, NWA says that doing so would alienate many immigrants and have a negative effect on the very goal of the census, which is to count every resident living in the United States.” -(NWA, 2018)

Judge blocks administration from deporting asylum seekers - - but the government already had two on a plane

August 9, 2018

“A federal judge on Thursday erupted at the Trump administration when he learned that two asylum seekers fighting deportation were at that moment being deported and on a plane to El Salvador.

DC District Judge Emmet Sullivan then blocked the administration from deporting the two plaintiffs while they are fighting for their right to stay in the US -- excoriating the administration and threatening to hold Attorney General Jeff Sessions in contempt.”- (CNN, 2018)

“It sends a message to the Hispanic community that we intend to racially profile you,” said an immigration attorney.”- (NBC, 2018)



Stephen Miller’s uncle criticizes his nephew on immigration

August 13, 2018

“According to Glosser, their family fled a village in what is now Belarus to escape anti-semitic pogroms. The eventually settled in the U.S., where they soon prospered.

“If my nephew's ideas on immigration had been in force a century ago, our family would have been wiped out,” Glosser writes.”- (CBS, 2018)

State of Virginia confirms immigrant teenagers were strapped to chairs with bags over their heads

August 13, 2018

“Children as young as 14 who said they were handcuffed, shackled and beaten at the facility. They also described being stripped of their clothes and locked in solitary confinement, sometimes strapped to chairs with bags over their heads.” - (NBC, 2018)
